<p>1. Design Draw an illustrated map of where you live. You can use anything to draw with or add paint or collage. You could add a compass, to show which way is north.</p>	<p>2. Design and Make Design a spaceship – this can be a labelled diagram or add a space background, you could build it from Lego or make it out of junk.</p>	<p>3. Observational Drawing Draw your toothbrush and toothpaste. Do you squeeze from the middle or roll from the end? You could also draw in the background. Are they in a cup or on a shelf or next to the tap?</p>	<p>4. Imaginative Drawing Draw a page full of fantasy fish. You could add pattern, colour or texture. They could overlap to create an abstract design or give them an underwater background.</p>	<p>5. Illustration Design a bookmark or a front cover for your favourite book.</p>
<p>6. Careful Observation Sit in front of a mirror and make a self-portrait. Look as closely as you can at the shape of your features and add light and dark too.</p>	<p>7. Cartoon Characters Draw you, your pet, friends and family as cartoon characters. You could then draw a cartoon strip using your characters, with a title and speech bubbles.</p>	<p>8. Observational Drawing Make a picture of an animal, either your pet or copy a picture from a book.</p>	<p>9. Pattern Fill the page with concentric circles; a circle in a circle in a circle... Hand-draw them and colour them in using an interesting colour scheme. Or, you could cut a large circle from coloured paper and then cut out smaller and smaller circles collaging them together.</p>	<p>10. Observational Drawing Make an observational drawing or collage of a pair of glasses. They could be on a table, on top of a book or on someone's nose! Is anything reflected in the lenses?!</p>
<p>11. Design Design a pair of fantasy glasses for anyone you choose - a footballer, astronaut, dancer, explorer, doctor, musician. You could draw them or try and make them!</p>	<p>12. Observational Drawing Make a picture of your favourite toys.</p>	<p>13. Make It Design a robot – this could be made out of junk, or Lego or it can be a labelled diagram or drawing. You could use tin foil, paper clips or other metallic bits and bobs.</p>	<p>14. Imaginative Drawing Design the most terrifying sea monster you can!!!! It could be lurking at the bottom of the ocean, hiding under a boat waiting to pull it down or leaping out of the water ready to snap a ship in half!</p>	<p>15. Bonus Challenges!!! Can you thread a needle? Can you tie an overhand knot? Can you sew a running stitch? Can you tie a reef knot? Can you tie a bow? </p>
