<p>1. Pattern Draw, paint or collage a page full of Easter Eggs. You could add pattern, colour or texture. They could be different sizes or all the same. You could overlap them to create an abstract design or make a pattern out of them.</p>	<p>2. Observational Drawing Make a picture of a rabbit, either your pet bunny or copy a picture from a book. Think carefully how to show the fur! It could be tricky!! You can just draw the rabbit as a study or put in a background. Don't forget to look for a shadow!</p>	<p>3. Imaginative Drawing Design the Easter Bunny's terrifying Evil Twin!! It could be massive and muscly or small and sinister! It could be lurking at the bottom of the garden, waiting to pounce or plotting how to EAT YOUR EGGS!!!!</p>	<p>4. Design Design a garden gnome. Is it going to be a traditional gnome? What will it be doing? If you already have a gnome, try drawing it first to help you study it closely, or make a page of studies using images from the internet.</p>	<p>5. Mark Making Using an inkpad or a little bit of paint on a plate, make a page of prints. This is when you press an object into ink or paint then onto your paper. The marks and patterns it makes are called a print.</p>
<p>6. Observational Drawing Draw a family member. Look as closely as you can at the shape of their features and add light and dark to give your drawing form. This means it will make your drawing look 3 dimensional.</p>	<p>7. Cartoon Characters Draw yourself and a page of jungle animals as cartoon characters. Are you an adventurer or lost in the jungle, or do you live there? You could then draw a cartoon strip using your characters, with a title and speech-bubbles or make a jungle picture adding imaginative plants and flowers.</p>	<p>8. Researching an Artist Copy your favourite illustration from a fictional book. Think about why you like it? Is it the subject matter, the style of the drawing, the mark making, the materials used, the colours used?</p>	<p>9. Inspired by Art Make your own illustration in the style of your favourite illustrator. You could write a story or poem to illustrate or choose a passage from a book. It may help to design your character/s first & decide where it is set. You could make some quick thumbnail sketches to plan it out.</p>	<p>10. Careful Observation Make an observational drawing, painting or collage of a shoe or pair of shoes. Look carefully at the laces/surface textures/scuff marks/creases. Is it new or worn? How can you tell this? How can you show this in your picture?</p>
<p>11. Design Design a pair of fantasy shoes or boots for anyone you choose – a clown, a racing driver, a gardener, an explorer, a movie star, or you!!!! You could draw them or try and make them!</p>	<p>12. Imaginative Drawing Make a page of Mini-Monsters!!! Use whatever materials you like! Collage with felt or fur or paper, draw with felts or crayons, paint, use bright colours or black and white.... but are they cute and cuddly or fierce and ferocious?</p>	<p>13. Make It Create a world for a Mini-Monster – does it live on a spaceship, another planet, in your fridge, under your bed, in your Dad's hair?!! Make it out of junk, or Lego. Add your monster – make it out of card, or Lego or salt-dough or something else!</p>	<p>14. Mark Making Fill a page with lots of different types of lines using all your different pens, pencils, crayons and felt tips. Make jerky lines or flowing lines, zigzag and wavy lines. Try using the hand you don't normally draw with too!</p>	<p>Bonus Challenge!!! Underline all the Art words on this sheet – do you know what they all mean? If not, how could you find out?
