Month	Title/Composer	Genre/style	Reason Chosen <i>(other than a good example of the selected style)</i>
1. September	Holst. 'Jupiter' from <i>The Planets</i>	20 <sup>th</sup> Century	British Values. This is a key British and local composer (from Cheltenham). E.g. of a 'Great Composer'. Links with British Sports Culture
2. October	'The Aquarium' from Saint-Saens, 'Carnival of the Animals'	Romantic	Good example of programmatic music (good example for younger children)
3. November	Gamelan Music from Bali, Indonesia	Gamelan (World Music)	Good example of World Music
4. December	Vivaldi, 'Winter' from <i>The Four Seasons</i>	Baroque Music	Good e.g. of Late Baroque Music. Easily remembered because of the programmatic nature. Example of a 'Great Composer'
5. January	'Three Little Birds' by Bob Marley	Reggae (Jamaican Music)	British Values, Black Culture
6. February	Gregorian chant by Hildegard von Bingen	Medieval/Gregorian chant	Female composer; church music
7. March	'Bhabiye Ni Bhabiye'	Bhangra (World Music)	British Values, Sikh culture
8. April	John Lennon, Imagine	1970s Pop Music	British Values. Popular Music; link with the Beatles and British Popular culture
9. May	'We'll meet Again', Vera Lynn	1940s Popular Song	Famous WWII Song; female artist
10. June	Tabla music from India (Ravi Shankar)	Indian music (Indian Classical Tradition)	British Values. World famous Indian Classical musician
11. July	Beethoven Symphony No.5 (I) in C minor	Classical/Romantic	Easily remembered example from the Classical tradition. E.g. of a 'Great Composer'
