How to Support Your Child's



Reading at Home



At BPS, Reading VIPERS are used to support children with their reading comprehension skills. It would be brilliant if you could also refer to VIPERS when listening to your child read at home.

We introduce reading VIPERS to children in Key Stage 2. If your child is in Key Stage 1 they may not be familiar with the VIPERS terminology, however the question stems provided below will still be relevant and accessible to them.

What are Vipers?

VIPERS is an acronym to aid the recall of the six reading domains as part of the UK's reading curriculum. They are the key areas which we feel children need to know and understand in order to improve their comprehension of texts.

What does VIPERS stand for?

Vocabulary - the words used in a text

Inference - a conclusion or opinion reached on the basis of evidence and reasoning

Prediction – estimation of what will happen in the future based on previous reading

Explanation - describing in more detail, saying why something has happened Retrieval - find or extract key information

Sequence or Summarise – arrange in chronological order or give a brief statement of the main points

How do I use VIPERS?

VIPERS can be used on any text that a child is reading. Below are some examples of how you can create your own questions to ask your child using the following question openers. These questions can be asked at the end of, or during your 20 minute reading session. You do not need to record any of your answers, just having the discussions would be great!
